

## PROFILE OIL & GAS GEOSCIENCE DIVISION VICE-CHAIR

An elected candidate for the position of Chair of the Oil & Gas Geoscience Division (OGGD) first serves a period of two years as vice-chair of the oil & gas geoscience committee followed by a second period of two years as Chair of the division and as member of the Board. The maximum tenure as board member is therefore two years.

### Responsibilities Vice- Chair OGGD

- The Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in the latter's absence.

### Responsibilities Chair OGGD

- Attend the board meetings, who meet five times per year: the Friday meeting of the annual conference in June (start of President's tenure), September, December, March and the Sunday meeting of the annual conference in June. An additional meeting may be held when actual developments require so.
- Manage the division and represent the division members' views at Board level.
- Chair of the Oil & Gas Geoscience Committee. The committee represents and promotes the interests of its division and ensures that each of the geoscientific and related engineering disciplines is adequately represented within EAGE and its committees.
- Organise several divisional committee meetings per year (the annual conference in June, September and February).
- Organise a dedicated session at the annual conference in June.

### Commitment chair OGGD

- Travelling to board meetings: a board meeting is normally spread over two days (one full and one half day). The meetings are predominantly held at the office in Houten (the Netherlands), but can also be organised at the location of an EAGE event.
- Representing the association at the annual conference & exhibition (6 days, June).

### Requirements chair OGGD

- EAGE member in good standing.
- Demonstrated active membership.
- Excellent intercultural communication skills.
- Permission to travel.
